The one on the ESE slope may have been skier triggered (by another group) and the rest appeared to be natural. We found a strong crust beneath the foot of new snow throughout our route. We didn't see any cracks or whumphs, and the new snow wasn't reactive in hand pits. The snow surface was getting wet as we exited to the beehive trailhead around 3pm."
